REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN:

Sirach 27:30 – 28:7 Romans 14: 7-9 Matthew 18: 21-35

In the 1970 film "Love Story" this classic line was spoken, "Love means never having so say you're sorry." How absurd that thought! How far-fetched from the Christian Scriptures and the Gospel way of life. Today's readings reveal just the opposite. True love is all about forgiveness and healing and wanting to make right one's relationship with others. Anger and wrath are to be set aside in favor of pardon and peace. Admitting you have hurt another is the beginning of reconciliation and the foundation for true lasting love. Saying you're sorry and asking for forgiveness is the sign of mature Christian love.

In today's first reading, the author Jesus Ben Sirach is ahead of his time in espousing not an eye-for-eye justice but forgiveness and mercy. Sirach says death and decay will surely come so set aside hatred and ill will. Or else one day you will realize that it is too late because the person who you had ill feelings towards has died. Then Jesus in the Matthew's Gospel tells Peter he must not forgive just seven times with seven being the perfect number signifying completeness. He must forgive seventy-seventy times or without stopping. Then Jesus drives home his teaching with a parable about a servant who owes the king an enormous debt. This servant pleads with the king and says he will pay it back. The king moved with compassion releases him from the enormous debt. This servant then goes out and finds a fellow servant who owes him a mere pittance of what he owed the king, but unlike the king this first servant is unwilling to forgive and shows no compassion.

So, we know what we must do, but doing it is the hard part. Forgiving is tough and forgetting the offenses committed against us is equally as tough. The readings especially the Gospel lay out this scenario for reflection. If God forgave us this huge debt which none of us could ever repay by Jesus's death on the cross, what should be our response to our brothers and sisters but forgiveness and reconciliation. Our God show us first how it must be done by wiping away our offenses. We must follow in the path of Jesus and do the same. Yet one caveat is necessary to understand this Gospel. Even though we must forgive one another doesn't mean that there aren't consequences for those who hurt us. There are social consequences for certain crimes.

What will it cost us to live out the message of these readings? First, it will demand lots and lots of prayer. Sometimes when we are hurt, the only way we can forgive and start the process of reconciliation is by praying for those who offended us. Second, it will demand real humility on our part not to want to punish our offender but to heal the division. Finally, the longer we harbor grudges and anger the more we are consumed by the hatred. We all have heard stories of people who were deeply harmed, and the hatred and anger they feel just smolders and ruminates in their lives. It's like a cancer that consumes one from the inside out. Through the grace of God when they forgive their perpetrators a tremendous load is removed from their heart. Forgiveness is God's gift to us, and one that we must give back as generously to others.
